### Chairman's Report

AGM 7 June 2009

In the twelve months since taking up the Chair of the Council, I have been particularly impressed by its close relationship with the Scottish Parliament. I doubt that any other Jewish community has found itself so deeply involved with the day to day work of its country's government.
