Research into the integration of people seeking asylum and refugees in Scotland

The Scottish Refugee Council is conducting a study about the integration of refugees and people seeking asylum in Scotland. The research will look at what works and what doesn't in terms of allowing asylum seekers and refugees to become full members of Scottish society. It will examine integration as a series of developments including health, housing, employment and education. It will also look at integration as a two-way process between the refugee community and the host community. The project started this summer, and will last for around 30 months, using questionnaires and interviews with as many refugees and people seeking asylum as possible, and will gather one-off responses as well as tracking some individuals through the process of integration. Enquiry forms for the Annual Canvass of Electors will be issued to every household in the city in August. In order to ensure that no one in their household loses their right to vote, names of all new residents should be added to the form and those of anyone no longer resident deleted. Parents should add details of all 16 and 17 year olds in their household to ensure that they can vote when they attain 18 years of age.
